Program Overview

Badges & How to Earn Them

- **Bravery Badge:** Standing up for a friend, trying something new, or speaking in front of the class.

- **Good Friend Badge:** Including someone who is left out, being a good friend, or helping a classmate.
- **Honesty Badge:** Telling the truth even when it's difficult and being trustworthy. Assisting a teacher, classmate, or staff member with a task.
- **Respect Badge:** Listening attentively, following school rules, and treating others kindly.
- **Good Helper Badge:** Awarded to students who consistently assist teachers, classmates, or staff with tasks such as organizing materials, cleaning up or offering help without being asked.
- **Love Badge:** Share kindness by giving a complement or expressing love to family.

Implementation in the Classroom

- Teachers can use the **Classroom Kindness Chart** to track students progress during class, recess, or any school activity where acts of kindness are observed.
- Schools may host **monthly kindness recognitions** or incorporate the challenge into existing character education programs.
- **School-Wide Kindness Wall** - Display students' achievements and encourage a culture of positivity.
- At the end of the challenge, a **special recognition event** or small celebration can be held to acknowledge student achievements.
